




Adult Cup Night 2006



Not having been awarded for several years, this year the **Lipton-Magoon Trophy** was awarded by Commodore **Larry Bradley** to transatlantic sailor **Alex McVay**. ◀ The trophy is awarded to an individual who has made an outstanding contribution to further the reputation of CPYC in the sailing world. Certainly having the CPYC burgee flying during **Alex's** transatlantic crossing to France in his Mini 21, *Genasun*, this past summer qualified him to receive this award. In 1930, the town of Winthrop celebrated the 300th year of its founding. At that time well known yachtsman **Sir Thomas J. Lipton** was persuaded to donate a trophy for three separate regattas which took place as a part of the town celebration. After some very

close racing, the trophy was won by CPYC skipper **John Magoon** in his Cottage Park Fifteen Footer. It is without question that this is the most beautiful and expensive trophy that was ever race for in Boston Harbor. In 1971, **Magoon** donated the **Lipton Cup** to CPYC in memory of his late wife.








Treasures of Snake Island Honan Explorations

Editors Note: Thanks to the Richard Honan and family, the Windjammer is launching a new series of articles issues that will explore places you can go and experiences you can have when you walk, row or paddle about our waters. The Winthrop shores offer an abundance of treasures most of us know nothing about. Richard has very kindly shared his adventures and photographs with the Windjammer.

On November 26th, it was still warm enough for a trip to Snake Island. Shortly after arriving ashore, **Richard, Mike Rausero, Ben**



Rodriguez, and little **Mike** found a bottle with a message in it on the beach. Of course they had to extract the message and read it. The message said: "Dear Receiver,



This is a message in a bottle. We wrote this letter on November 1st, 2006 in Boston Massachusetts and are waiting to hear from you who found the bottle. Please write a postcard from where you found this bottle."

The address was the Visual Arts Program at M.I.T. **Richard** replied and sent pictures of finding the bottle. In December, he received the following email:

"Thank you for responding to our message in a bottle! I thought you would be interested to know that we (**Annatina, Haruka, Marika, and Steve**) are MIT students, and sent the message as part of a semester project for our Visual Arts Class, 'The Production of Space: Dialogues in Art, Architecture, and Urbanism.'

For our project, 'Reach out and Map Someone,' we sent cameras and notebooks around the world with certain rules and prompts for participations (For example, the rules for one of the disposable cameras was to take a picture of a place where you spend a lot of time, find someone to pass the camera to, and take a picture



of them, before passing it on...). As the materials came back, we were not only able to map the physical travels of the individual items, but also the human interactions that took place, and the relationships between the data that we received....

While we were amazed to just receive a response, the circumstance in which we received your notes and photos was absolutely incredible... We only released one message in a bottle (from the Harvard Bridge on November 1st), and never really expected to get it back, not this semester at least. It was merely a gesture paralleling our project: sending something out there, and waiting to see what (if anything) comes back.

And then the surreal happened, as we were setting up for our final presentation and review of the project... There was a short break between our presentation, and the one before ours. At that time, a fellow student came in with an envelope, and gave it to us...saying it had been delivered to the Visual Arts department. Because of the size, we assumed it was just another notebook... We were happy to have gotten it, but it wouldn't have done us much good, as we were about to present in a matter of minutes.

Then, as we opened the envelope, we discovered that it was our response to our message in the bottle, and we could not believe that it had arrived...and at that very moment! We then presented our project and saved the incredible news for the end. There was some build-up as we showed old video of the release, and our bottle floating away on the water. We talked about the message as a metaphor for our project, and we never expected to get it back:

But there was just one more thing... and we announced we had just received your note...there was an amazing response..."

The email was signed **Steve Preston**. The bottle had traveled about 4 miles on its journey.

During this trip to Snake Island, the **Honan** troop also found coins located in the center of the island atop of what possibly looked like a small pirate's grave. Could Black Beard the pirate have buried treasure on




Snake Island? One was a 1913 wheat penny and the other a 1970 Bermuda 50 cent piece.





Upcoming Book Club Selections
