

• Outside food can no longer be brought into the Pilot House. Members who wish to order food from another establishment are welcome to eat in the function hall or on the Sun Deck, but please, not in the Pilot House.

• An automatic 15% service charge will be added to the FOOD portion of your tab. Feel free to adjust this gratuity, especially if your tab includes other purchases in the Pilot House.

• No children under the age of 18 are to be in the Pilot House. (Subject to Change)

• Take-out orders are welcome, but only if placed in person at the Pilot House Bar. At this time, we can not accept phone orders.

• Procedure for ordering food is to place an order with the bartender who will open a tab for you in your name. When the order is ready, you name will be called out to pick up your food at the bar.

Rules Reminder To All CPYC Members

Alcohol Regulations

Due to the Town by-laws regarding alcohol, it is important to note the following: •

- Closing time, as set by our license, is 12:00 AM, Sunday through Thursday and 1:00AM Friday and Saturday.
- Last call will be one half hour before closing.
- All tables and the bar counter will be cleared of alcoholic beverages 15 minutes after closing time.
- NO customers may have alcohol in their possession after the tables and bar have been cleared.
- All customers MUST be off the premises within 30 minutes of clos-

ing time.

- All guests must sign the book.
- No children under 18 are allowed to stay in the pilot house.
- All doors are to be secured at all times. Please DO NOT leave them open.
- Only alcoholic beverages purchased at the club may be consumed on the pier, in the clubhouse or on the deck.
- No glasses or bottles may be taken from the bar to the pier where they can be easily broken. Plastic cups are available for drinks outside the club house.



Summer Overnight Parking at CPYC

July 1, 2005 the Town of Winthrop instituted a parking ban on all streets in Winthrop between the hours of 1:00 am and 5:00 am. 




