## A Fitting Tribute

Over one hundred people turned out on Saturday June 9, 2012 for the dedication of the new **Norman F. Siefert Ferry Terminal**. Family, friends and elected officials joined together to honor, long time Winthrop resident, Life Member of member of the Cottage Park Yacht Club and good friend **Norman Siefert** for his many years of service advocating for Winthrop Harbor.

Speaker of the House, **Robert Deleo**, along with State Senator **Anthony Petrucelli** and Town Council President **Peter Gill** spoke about **Norman** and his determination and his love of Winthrop Harbor.

**Norm** spent his youth in Winthrop Harbor, rowing and sailing around what was Apple and Governors Island (now part of Logan Airport). He was always concerned about water safety, and ensuring that future generations would enjoy the harbor as much as he did while growing in Winthrop.

**Norman** told an amusing story about the attempt to dredge the entire area off of Washington Avenue with an estimate of \$2,000,000.00 and only \$29.38 in the Harbor Management Account. It was but a bump in the road; it never slowed **Norman** down one bit. He tried to explain the younger folks in the audience that the word "no" is not in his vocabulary. When you have idea and you present it . . . . . never accept the word "no". It took a lot of work, but because **Norm** refused to accept "no" as an answer, the mud flats off of Snake Island were finally removed.



## Report from the Dredging Committee ———

At the request of the Dredging Committee, the Board of Directors voted unanimously at its May 17th regular meeting to authorize our engineer to apply for the necessary permits for the dredging project. For greater efficiency and lower cost this effort will be undertaken in conjunction with the Marina expansion effort. Because of the favorable test results that were obtained last winter it is anticipated that CPYC will be authorized to dispose of the dredging material offshore at the Massachusetts Bay Disposal Site rather than having it trucked upland for disposal at 4 to 5 times the cost. As a result, it is anticipated that the costs for dredging and disposal will be approximately \$500,000-600,000 based upon contractor estimates that have been received by our engineer, Bob Cummings of Engineering and Managements Services, Inc. A dedicated Dredging Fund was created a few years ago not only to meet the funding needs of the present project but also the club's future dredging needs through regular contributions from the club's revenues on an annual basis rather than being forced to scramble for funds when the need is imminent. The need for reoccurring dredging is a predictable constant given the marine dynamics of Winthrop Harbor. It is much like replacing a roof on a home; every 20 years you have to do it again. Over the last few years the Board of Directors has unanimously voted to direct deposits into the Dredging Fund which, along with funds raised through dredging fees paid by boat owners using the marine facilities, has resulted in a little over \$250,000 being added to the Dredging Fund. Although budgeted for \$125,000, the sampling and testing costs came in at approximately \$91,000, leaving a current balance of the Dredging Fund is approximately \$162,000. Once the project is permitted and "shovel ready" the Dredging Committee will be in a better position to obtain more competitive bids from interested contractors and to seek alternative sources of funding. Our engineer anticipates that the permitting process will last from 4 to 6 months.

## CPYC MARINA SAFETY

From the Officers and Board of Directors

Summer is finally upon us! We've already had several days with temps in the 90s; boats fill both our marina and mooring field; and the Youth Sailing and Adult Sailing programs are in full swing.

With another busy season of club sponsored programs and regattas, the CPYC Officers and Board of Directors would like to remind everyone of a few safety issues that should be considered when using the marina facilities.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and have a fun and safe boating season.

#### Head Pier/Docks

- All children ages 12 and under must wear life jackets when on the head pier or docks.
- No jumping or diving from head pier or docks.
- No running on the head pier or docks.
- No climbing on the dinghy/kayak/laser racks.

#### Hoists

- Please remain well clear of the hoist areas when boats are being hauled and launched.
- Be mindful of swinging boats, dangling lines, moving trailers and lowered security netting.
- There is to be NO hoist use without supervision by an adult or other responsible person.
- No hanging on the netting used for securing the head pier openings in the hoist areas.

#### General

- With the dry sailing and various small boats (dinghies/lasers/kayaks) primarily being launched from the Easterly side of the marina, please be considerate of vessels entering into and out of their slips. With the close confines of the "corral", the low profile of the dinghies and kayaks, and the need for the larger boats to maintain headway speed, ALL operators must remain vigilant when operating in this area.
- There are various swim ladders located throughout the marina facility. While swimming is not prohibited within the confines of the marina, SWIMMERS must be aware of vessel activity around them.



The Junior Sailing program got under way the week of June 25th with an cookout on Wednesday the 27th. The turnout was tremendous and all seemed to have a fun evening, eating and swimming.



A fun and exciting season is planned. Returning is a very talented group of instructors led by **Lianne Laubscher**. Lianne and her staff

will have around 65 children in the program with about 35 children in the extended beginners group. The beginners will be sailing Opti's and N10's while the older kids will mostly be sailing lasers and 420's.

The program would not be possible without the hard work of many of our members, including the YS committee (**Tom Montgomery, Theresa Moreira, Amy Rodriguez, Kim Kennedy and Stephanie Costin**) who spent hours getting ready for the season.

The Flag Officers and BOD have been supportive and committed to the program. 



## Book Club


