From the Board of Directors ———

To All Members,

The start of the 2014 boating season is finally upon us! Boats are beginning to fill both our marina and mooring field; Wednesday Night PHRF racing has begun; the Youth Sailing and Adult Sailing programs are starting another successful season; and Blessing Of The Fleet is right around the corner.

With another busy season of club sponsored programs and regattas, the CPYC Officers and Board of Directors would like to remind everyone of a few safety issues that should be considered when using the marine facilities.

Thank you in advance for your cooperation and have a fun and safe boating season.

CPYC Officers and CPYC BOD

Head Pier/Docks

All children ages 12 and under must wear life jackets when on the head pier or docks.

No jumping or diving from head pier or docks.

No running on the head pier or docks.

No climbing on the dinghy/kayak/laser racks.

Hoists

Please remain well clear of the hoist areas when boats are being hauled and launched.

Be mindful of swinging boats, dangling lines, moving trailers and lowered security netting.

There is to be **NO** hoist use without supervision by an adult or other responsible person.

Please remove/replace the hoist railings using two people at either end and safely store without creating a tripping hazard during the use of the hoist.

No hanging/swinging on the chains securing the ladder openings in the hoist areas.

General

With the dry sailing and various small boats (dinghies/lasers/kayaks) primarily being launched from the Easterly side of the marina, please be considerate of vessels entering into and out of their slips.

With the close confines of the "corral", the low profile of the dinghies and kayaks, and the need for the larger boats to maintain headway speed, **ALL** operators must remain vigilant when operating in this area.

There are various swim ladders located throughout the marina facility. While swimming is not prohibited within the confines of the marina, **SWIMMERS** must be aware of vessel activity around them.

Youth Sailing Program Kicks Off



On June 16th the Youth Sailing held its informational night for parents of children attending the summer program. During the well attended meeting **Kim Kennedy** reviewed the rules and regulations for the program with emphasis on safety, equipment needed, behavior expected, special activities for the program, and appropriate lines of communication. Restoring The Youth Sailing N10s

Dubbed the "N10 Project" the Youth Sailing N10 fleet has undergone extensive repairs and re-rigging. The result is a flotilla of dinghies that are safe, functional, and something the kids can be proud to sail. The effort began last spring with raising donated parts (about \$8,000 worth!) and took about 400 man hours to complete in time for the start of the Y.S Hardware and 8 layers of paint were removed from 4 boats. Holes and cracks were patched. CB pin areas were rebuilt with fiberglass glass and resin donated by Ward Marine. A500 structural foam Ward before

Ward. A500 structural foam coring was donated by Gurit. All the boats hulls and decks were faired and sanded



being painted. New names were applied compliments of Honan Sing Co. "Thank You!" to Interlux for donating all the paints, primers, and solvents for the project; and to at Shirley Hardware for lots of sandpaper, brushes, and rollers. Cams & blocks donated by Harken; goose-necks, stay adjusters, and stainless hardware by Race-Lite/Southcoast; new shrouds, by Marblehead Trading Co., discounted masts from Dwyer; lines New England Ropes and Samson; the volunteers who did the work. All the boats are now well equipped and uniform, thanks to the efforts of **Rick Clancy** who spearheaded the project.
