2006 Annual Meeting Held Feb 15th

The annual meeting of the CPYC was called to order by Commodore **John Condon** at 8:05 PM on February 15, 2006. There were 94 members in attendance.

The membership stood as the names of this years departed members were read and a bell tolled; **William T. Montgomery, J.T. J O'Brien, John H. Diamond, Jr, and Warren A. Kirby, Sr. Elaine and Philip Marks** were thanked for reconditioning the bowling pins and for purchasing new balls. The members who cleaned and painted the bowling alleys on New Year's Day were also thanked. (See story page 5) Lastly, Ladies Bowling League president **Claire Hubbard** was thanked for her efforts in forming new bowling groups on Monday and Thursday evenings. So far seven members have express interest. (The letter is on page 6) In the absence Secretary **John Economides, David Hubbard** gave the secretaries annual report on the general condition of the membership. As of Dec. 31, 2005 there were 431 members with roll numbers. This represents a decrease from previous years. Of the members with roll numbers, 39% have boats, (166 members have 215 boats.) As always there is data missing from the CPYC files. However it is of particular concern that there are no email addresses for 192 members. The average age of the membership is 54 years. Winthrop residents make up 62% of the membership with 32% in the rest of MA, and 7% out of state. Participants in bowling number 144, pool 12, and darts, 22.

Next Treasurer **Don Kearney** and Finance Committee Chairman **Dave Aloise** presented the annual report of the Treasurer and Finance Committees. Complete copies of these reports are available to the membership. In summary, revenues fell off from 2004 because of a membership decline effecting both operations and capital improvements; weaker non-membership revenue gains; and higher operating costs. On the positive side there were unplanned gains from the Pilot House and regatta events. A tremendous amount of important work was completed in 2005. The Marine Facilities operation was comparable to 2004. While the year end li-

quidity is tight it is improved over 2004.

The operating budget that was presented for 2006 is a preliminary budget which needs to be revisited by the new administration in light of membership levels, effect of increased entertainment activities, and escalating operating coats.

Pursuant to Article III Sec 1.H. **Joseph A Grasso** was present for election to life membership. **Joe** was unanimously elected. (See article on page 2)

The Nominating Committee presented its slate for 2006-2007.

The following officers and board were elected unanimously:

Commodore **Lawrence G. Bradley**; Vice Commodore **Louis R. Todisco**; Rear Commodore **Ellen M. Reilly**; Treasurer **Donald Kearney**; Secretary **John Economides**; Board of Directors **Stephen C. Bulkley** and **Suzanne S. Hardy**; Audit Committee, **Tom D. Bailey, Ernest E. Hardy Jr, and David A. Aloise.**

Though errantly omitted from the call of the meeting, the Officers and Board of Directors requested that Article III Section I Paragraph D, payment of an initiation fee, be waived until 3/1/07. The intent of this is to continue encouraging new members. It passed 93 to 1.

Steve Merola reviewed the survey form that the members have been asked to fill out. Copies will be mailed out to all those not in attendance at the meeting.

Rear Commodore Rich McKinnon's Farewell Message




