## From the Board of Director's

### CPYC Rowing Tender Rules of Use

CPYC owns and maintains two rowing tenders. These tenders are for use in rowing and transportation out to one's boat on a mooring. No other use of these tenders is authorized. Attaching a motor of any sort is forbidden. Please take care of the tenders as if they were your own boat. We understand things can break. Please report any damage to the Marine Facilities Committee, the bosun/launch-driver, the Wharfinger or even a bartender. You are asked to leave the tenders in the same condition as you found them or even better condition. Please remember above all else to use good Seamanship when using the CPYC tenders.

### Please observe the following rules

- CPYC tenders are for the use of mooring holders strictly for transportation to and from their boats.
  - The use of outboard motors on the CPYC tenders is strictly prohibited.
  - When finished using a tender please return it to the tenders dock (not the dinghy dock) and tie up portside to.
  - Please bail or sponge the tender dry before and after each use.
  - Please properly secure and store the oars to prevent their loss, breakage or damage to the boat.
  - Please refrain from using the tenders longer than a half hour at a time. Others could be waiting to use them as well.
  - Please report any damage to the MFC, Bosun/Launch-driver, Wharfinger or bartenders.
- The tenders are NOT work boats and should not be used as such. Towing with tenders, the setting or removing of moorings, etc. are prohibited.





*Winthrop Vessel Safety Check Day Saturday June 14<sup>th</sup>*

Mark your boating calendar now for **Saturday June 14<sup>th</sup>** when the USCG Auxiliary Winthrop Flotilla will be conducting courtesy Vessel Safety Checks (VSC's) at each Winthrop Marina and Yacht Club marine facilities. Vessels passing safety checks are awarded a U.S. Coast Guard / Auxiliary Decal that informs the Coast Guard, and other boating law-enforcement & safety agencies that your boat is in full compliance with all Federal and State boating laws for 2014. Best of all every Vessel Safety Check is 100% FREE OF CHARGE and can be conducted at your dock or on your trailer. Vessel examinations can be scheduled online at <http://cgaux.org/vsc>

If your boat does not pass, no citation is issued at that time. Instead, you are provided a written report on how to correct any discrepancies. Recreational Boating Safety Team Members will issue West Marine discount coupons for safety equipment to help boaters acquire any safety items they were missing during the vessel examination. Items missing or non-operating that are required by state and federal laws can result in a citation by the Coast Guard or Massachusetts Environmental Police if they inspect your vessel.

It's a “wake-up call” for your responsibilities. You'll learn about your vessel, and operating principles. Also included are descriptions of boating mishaps, and how to minimize them. Misfortune occurs in seconds, and you have the rest of your life to be grateful that you knew what to do because you were prepared.




## Book Club

The classic tragic story of a totally


different life and disinterested marriage, it also sheds light in the diamond industry of Kimberley, South Africa.





